



The UK Modern Slavery Act 2015

Introduction

Tough Furniture Limited once again fall under the £36m turnover threshold for duty to produce a statement and full reporting responsibilities on Modern Slavery as articulated in the published government guidance document “Transparency in Supply Chains: A Practical Guide”.

“3.1 Any organisation in any part of a group structure will be required to comply with the provision and produce a statement if they:

- are a body corporate or a partnership (described as an “organisation” in this document), wherever incorporated;*
- carry on a business, or part of a business, in the UK;*
- supply goods or services; and*
- have an annual turnover of £36m or more.”*
